Ric Minks submitted the following report:

Still struggling in the garden with the severe drought; San Antonio's average rainfall is approximately 30". This year's rainfall was 11.53". Our winter crop of vegetables were looking good, however, they were depleted by the harsh, 16 degree weather during the Christmas weekend. New Year's Drum Circle welcomed 2023 on Sunday, January 1.

Spring Garden Party is in the planning stages with an April date to be determined.

Garden volunteers are always welcome the second Saturday of each month – our next work day is January 14 at 10am.

RANCH MOTEL PROJECT

Observant neighbors have noticed construction work on the Ranch Motel at 3101 Broadway starting and stopping over the past several years. And have noticed it restarting last month. The new owner/developer of the Ranch Motel also owns the adjacent, 1 acre site which was the former home of Kiddie Park.

In 2018, the City's Office of Historic Preservation and the Historic & Design Review Commission approved the previous owner's plan to demolish a portion of the motel to add vehicle access to/from Avenue B, but the work was never completed.

The current effort to reimagine the 1948 motel as a "boutique motel hotel" includes upgrades to the 26 rooms, installation of a swimming pool, and a redesigned landscaped. The former Kiddie Park property may be utilized as a site for food trucks.

WHAT CAN I DO TO MAKE MAHNCKE PK EVEN BETTER?

I know I live in a great neighborhood, but even Mahncke Park is not perfect. Here are some ways I can improve it. Generally, they mean paying attention to my impact on my neighbors and on the entire neighborhood.

My physical space

- Within my physical limits, is my yard pleasant to look at? Are the sidewalks clear or is vegetation taking over the sides and making them narrower? Could I walk with a friend shoulder to shoulder without either of us getting assaulted by shrubs or trees?
- Do I have a neighbor who needs help with their yard and sidewalks? Could I do it or find someone else who can?
- Do I make sure to bring my trash cans in the day they are picked or the next morning, and then make sure they're stored behind the front face of the house? Do I have neighbors who could use my help taking the cans in and out?
- Could I pick up trash from my yard and from the yards and parking areas I pass as I walk by?
- Do I make sure to clean up after my dog as I walk, regardless of where he eliminates, whether it is in a yard or in the scruffy area next to a parking lot?
- Do I pay attention to where I park, making sure I don't block sidewalks and park only on the driveway? If I park on the street, do I take care not to block driveways?
- Do I pay attention to the volume of my television or speakers or car or bike or lawn mower, making sure not to disturb my neighbors, especially late at night or early in the morning?

Welcoming Newcomers

- Do I introduce myself to people new to the block?
 Could I take them a snack and let them know where important services and businesses are nearby?
- Could I host a backyard gathering, making sure to invite new neighbors?
- Do I make sure they get a newsletter, perhaps by being a Block Captain and taking a few minutes every month to make sure everyone on my block gets one?

Checking on Others

 Are there people in my immediate neighborhood that may need help with basics, like food or lifting heavy things? Do I pay attention to Code Compliance issues like improperly-parked cars or construction, making sure that there are permits for that work?

Finally, do I get out and enjoy the green spaces in the neighborhood? It's good for me and good for Mahncke Park.
