## SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY IN N'HOOD - BE ALERT!

Please be aware suspicious incidents have occurred recently during daylight hours within our area. In one situation, painters appeared, walked through an unlocked back gate, sized up the house for an exterior paint job — one the owners did not request. When questioned, the "painters" indicated they had been hired by a third party who approved their entry onto the property. Report was filed with SAPD.

We urge all neighbors to be vigilant for unusual activity and keep doors locked and house alarms set when not at home.

#### NEIGHBORHOOD CONSERVATION DISTRICT, PART 1

A Neighborhood Conservation District (NCD) is a zoning overlay district which imposes standards in addition to zoning and building code standards on new construction, as well as additions and renovations to existing structures, which require a building permit. The purposes of an NCD include "to protect and strengthen desirable and unique physical features, design characteristics and recognized identity and charm" of a neighborhood.

The Mahncke Park NCD planning process began in 2005 and continued over two years. The Planning Team concluded that character-defining elements the neighborhood included: driveways separated houses; parking and garages or carports, where present, were behind houses; dwelling main entries were defined by transition spaces such as porches, stoops, alcoves, courts or nooks; front yard sidewalks; a common pattern of front façade doors and windows; and few front yard fences. The Planning Team held four public meetings in 2005 and 2006, and a copy of the proposed design standards and a ballot were mailed to all neighborhood property owners. A majority of the ballots were returned in favor of the NCD. City Council adopted the Mahncke Park NCD in January 2008.

In April 2019, City Council approved revisions to the Mahncke Park NCD. The revisions clarified and simplified provisions, conformed provisions to revised building codes and State law, strengthened "grandfathering" of existing conditions, and deleted or modified difficult-to-enforce provisions.

#### JAMES GAFFNEY HONORED ON 100<sup>TH</sup> BIRTHDAY

James Gaffney celebrated his 100 years this month with friends, family and neighbors near his home on Eleanor Avenue. Born in 1923 in his family's home near the Southern Pacific RR tracks, Gaffney grew up in San Antonio and attended Brackenridge High School, where he played football — in fact, he played in Alamo Stadium the day it opened and scored the first points in the stadium's history. (For the other team when he intercepted a pass in his team's end zone and was inadvertently tackled by a teammate).

He married in November 1941, joined the US Coast Guard in 1942, and went to sea in 1943 aboard the North Star, which fired upon a surfaced German submarine between the ship & the Canadian coast. They overshot the sub & hit the shoreline, becoming the only US ship that fired on Canada during WWII. Later, his ship served in Greenland, then in 1944 he supported the Normandy invasion. Returning to San Antonio in 1945 to his wife and daughter, Gaffney held several jobs (Kelly Field, Rose Cadillac, Lincoln-Mercury) before joining the SA Police Dept. in 1954. "The best decision in my life," he said. Gaffney was promoted to detective after five years, then promoted to sergeant five years later. He supervised detectives in Homicide, Robbery, Burglary & Theft, then served in SAPD's Community Relations Division prior to retirement. Recently, Gaffney was recognized for his service by SAPD Chief William McManus. We are proud and fortunate to have Mr. James Gaffney as our neighbor in Mahncke Park and send him our very best wishes for his 100<sup>th</sup> birthday this month.
