## LAMAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS SCHEDULE SLIPS

A \$16M improvement project at Lamar Elementary School on Parland Place was approved in 2020 as part of the SA Independent School District's bond issue campaign. Senior Executive Director Yvonne J. Little of SAISD's Construction & Development Services Dept. presented project details at the Mahncke Park Neighborhood Association (MPNA) meeting in March 2022, including a timeline with construction to be complete in July 2024. That schedule has slipped.

Ms. Little submitted the following update last month:

"The SAISD Bond Program is working through supply chain and labor shortages created by the pandemic. The first phase of bond projects has started construction, and we are now working on the next round. Based on the bids received from the first round of projects construction cost is reflecting a 25% – 35% increase since the pre-pandemic planning stages. Through strategic planning and extensive cost containment strategies the district has been able to keep projects in an allowable budget. These savings do not come without changes to design, materiality, and constructability."

"The Lamar project is not immune to the current market conditions. Recently the Lamar Elementary School project was temporarily put on hold as the district evaluated the market conditions. Currently we are taking a deep dive into design and evaluating scope options that will deliver the academic program needed for the campus. The Project team made up of the SAISD Project Managers, Architect and General Contractor, are developing options for the campus and stakeholders to review in August. Once the final project scope to budget alignment is agreed upon, the project will be put out for bid in Q2 of 2024, with Construction planned to start in June of 2024."

#### **GOATS BACK TO BRACK**

Following a formal "welcome back" event on June 14, Brackenridge Park had some hungry visitors staying in the park for almost two weeks. For the second year in a row, about 150 goats from Ruminants for Rent were hired to sample the green goodies of the park. In less picturesque terms, their job was to clear out underbrush and low-lying bushes. The goats began their nibbling from behind temporary, electric fencing alongside the railroad track visible from Avenue B.

Ruminants for Rent is based near Abilene, Texas and is owned by Carolyn and Kyle Carr. Terry Carr, Kyle's father, was brought out of retirement by his son and daughter-in-law to assist in the operation, which included answering questions from people curious about the goats. A role he clearly loved and was very good at. He pointed out there were female goats and neutered male goats as part of the Brackenridge Park crew, and that although it may have looked like there were a bunch of goats just standing around taking a long coffee break, they were really chewing their respective cuds, bringing up what they had already eaten and breaking it down further so their digestive system could handle it. Terry also cleared up a misconception about horns; both male and female goats have them, and the horns grow constantly. Terry noted that they have a mixture of 4 breeds of goats: Spanish, Boar, Nubian, and Alpine. These goats aren't quite pets, but nearly. The Carrs know their goats by name without looking at the name on each goat's ear tag. And Terry admitted some of the goats are a little spoiled, begging for treats, and often receiving them.

Since goats can clear vegetation without chemicals and can work on slopes too steep for mowers, Ruminants for Rent is in great demand. Their schedule is full for the next few months, so don't get rid of your lawnmower just yet.

# CARNAHAN STREET FESTIVAL A GRAND SUCCESS

The Carnahan Street Festival on June 17 was a blistering success with over 100 area residents & friends attending. A food pop-up served pulled-pork tostadas & shrimp ceviche. The Mahncke Park Neighborhood Association (MPNA) and the Mahncke Park Community Garden were both represented by volunteers, signing up new members and accepting some donations. There was a bouncy castle for kids and very popular paletas for everyone – over 100 were given away. A stage was constructed at the end of the street and live music was performed. The Swinging Richards from the Lavaca Neighborhood just south of downtown played first. Then the band Hogg Shedd performed - featuring Mahncke Park neighbor Dan Lopez of 355 Carnahan. A hot, safe, fun time.

Last month we welcomed new Area Captain Kali Kurth but incorrectly identified her street – Kali and her family live on Claremont, not Natalen Avenue. Our veteran Area Captains are Francille Lewis Radmann of Elmhurst Avenue and Polly Noel of Queen Anne Court.
