LAMAR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

The S.A. Independent School District has proposed closing Lamar Elementary School, 201 Parland Place, and relocating students to Hawthorne Pk-8 Academy at 115 W. Josephine Street for the 2024-2025 school year. In addition to Lamar, 18 other schools have been recommended for closure. The SAISD School Board will vote on the proposed closure plan in November.

Regarding the \$21.5M in bond funds for improvements at Lamar which voters approved in November 2020, SAISD staff stated "bond funds would follow the students" to Hawthorne.

BIKE LANES STILL MISSING ON N. NEW BRAUNFELS Neighbors continue hoping for the return of bike lanes on N. New Braunfels Avenue between Eleanor Avenue and Burr Road. The bike lanes disappeared in April when N. New Braunfels was resurfaced. Public Works Dept. replaced crosswalks and center lane striping in June, but stripes defining bike lanes remain missing.

NEIGHBORHOOD HISTORY, 310 ELMHURST AVENUE The single story, stucco cottage at 310 Elmhurst Avenue was built as part of Robert McGarraugh's Elmhurst Addition Development in the 1920's. The house has varied roof lines and like most of McGarraugh's other properties developed on Elmhurst the roof pitch is quite steep – a style sometimes called a "cat slide roof."

Original owners of 310 Elmhurst were Colonel & Mrs. Wm. Hensley. Per the <u>SA Light</u> newspaper, Col. Hensley was "noted as an airplane, balloon and autogyro pilot" and a "pioneer of the American Air Force." Following his death in 1929, Naval Air Station Dallas was established & named Hensley Field in his honor. His widow Mattie Hensley raised their two children and she lived in the house until her death in the mid 1970's.

The son, William, earned a law degree at age 19 and passed the Texas Bar Exam with the highest grade in its history at that time. He was a pilot during WWII; Major Hensley led his B-29 squadron in 23 missions over "the Japanese empire." After the war, he was elected Bexar County District Attorney & served 1946-1951, and was known as the "crusading DA" for reforming courthouse procedures & pursuing notorious gambler Red Barry, among others. Hensley was the founding commander of the Texas Air National Guard's 182nd Fighter Squadron. He died at 33 when his aircraft crashed just prior to his squadron's deployment to Korea. William Hensley is buried at Arlington National Cemetery.

URBAN WILDLIFE: CO-EXISTING WITH NATURE

Wildlife living in our neighborhood must be clever to survive and to survive they must eat. Frequently they expand their diet beyond frogs, toads, crawdads, mice, rats, roaches, bird eggs, & wild fruit to include what humans make available to them. Garbage bins/cans without tops or secure lids can be toppled by raccoons & possoms - consider a bungee cord to secure a loose top or call 311 to request replacement bins for those with missing or broken tops. Also, leaving pet food outside is inviting to wildlife.

Wildlife Rescue & Rehabilitation suggests "repel techniques" to avoid wild animals taking up residence in your home. Sprinkle cayenne pepper generously in areas where an animal has been coming & going. Take 6 to 15 strips of 1" wide fabric, soak strips in household ammonia; wearing rubber gloves, place the soaked strips under the house or in the attic. During the day, playing loud music or placing a radio under the house or in the attic with annoying talk radio at high volume may dissuade nocturnal animals and relatives from visiting.

PORCH PIRATES & SAPD'S RECOMMENDATION

Regarding "porch pirates" stealing packages delivered to your front door, Officer Hernandez recommends victims of this crime submit reports to SAPD, particularly if your security system captured a photo of the thief. Reporting your burglary may link culprit to other crimes and affect the punishment. (Several neighbors have agreements to collect each other's front door packages, returning them when their neighbor is back home).

SAPD Officer Juan Hernandez patrols our neighborhood. Officer Juan Hernandez' duty hours are M-F, 7am-3pm. He regularly attends the MPNA's monthly meetings and provides information regarding illegal activity. Contact him regarding concerns or to request a "patrol by" of your property while out of town.
